



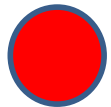

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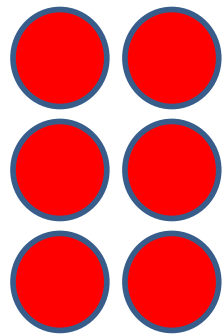
Different perspectives on the same material

- New groups form where the students present their views on the issue from their perspective
- The groups try to come up with a solution that is acceptable to everyone as far as possible

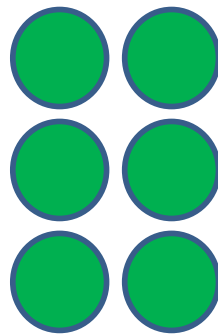

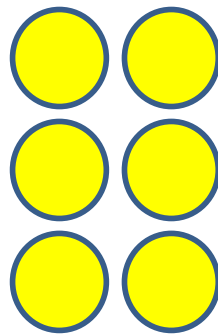
Step 2: The students work in groups

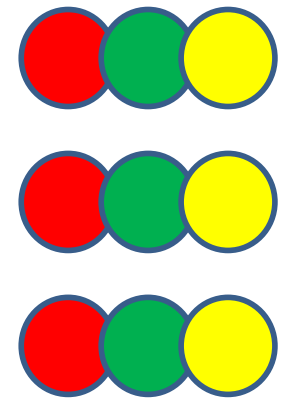
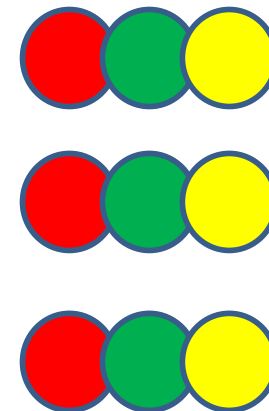
